Terms and Conditions

Terms and Conditions

- Funding is limited, and submitting a rebate application does not guarantee you will receive a rebate. Rebates will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis until funding is depleted.
- Limited to NID Residential treated water customers only. *Residential is defined as single-family homes.*
- Limit of one toilet rebate per parcel served by the Nevada Irrigation District per year. Verification is required. The service address must be for the location the toilet is installed.
- Purchase and installation are required within 90 days of approval of application. Applications will be void after 90 days of receipt. Applicant must fill out new application with no guarantee of available funds.
- Tenants may be eligible to participate with written consent of a property owner. Renters name must be on the bill.
- Applicant must submit a copy of the sales receipt and proof of installation prior to receiving rebate check.
- Proof of installation is required and may be subject to on-site inspection. Examples may include: photo of before and after installation, plumbers bill, etc..
- Applicants must provide proof that toilet being replaced is 1.6 gallons per flush or more.
- High-efficiency toilets must be 1.28 gallons per flush or less.
- Rebates limited to \$100 or the actual cost , whichever is less. This does not include tax, shipping, or installation.
- The Nevada Irrigation District makes no representation or warranty relating to toilets, including any hazardous substances that may be contained in the product
- Applicant waives and releases NID and its contractors or agents from all claims and causes of action arising out of the installation and use of devices pursuant to the Toilet Rebate Program.
- A reduced water bill is not guaranteed.
- Final Rebate will not be issued until proof of installation is returned to NID and has been reviewed and approved.

Applicant agrees to be bound by the terms and conditions set forth in this application and the District's rules, regulations and policies governing water use .
